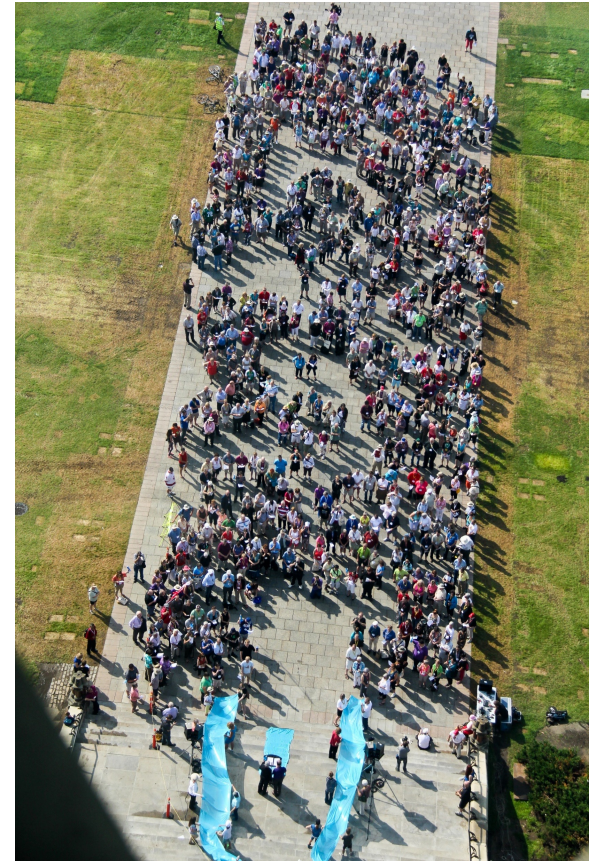
History of full communion justice work

- 2013 Joint Assembly

 - resource extraction
 - right to water

- 2023 Assembly
 - pandemic delayed
 - request for discernment resource



Principles informing the resource
